ACCEPTABLE MATERIALS

- Computers, Monitors, Televisions, Printers, Scanners, Phones, Fax Machines (start at \$ 3.00/item)
- Peripherals (i.e., mico, drives, keyboards, etc.)
- Household Cleaning Products
- Murlatic Acid
- Pesticides, Herbicides and Fertilizers
- Oil-based Paints, Stain's, Lacquers and Varnishes
- Paint Thinners, Removers and Solvents
- Automotive Fluids
 - Antifreeza
 - Motor OII (many recycling depots and service stations also accept used motor oil, but please call prior to delivering)
 - Transmission, Steering and Brake Fluids
 - Gasoline, Kerosene, Diesel Fuel
- Batteries
 - Automotive, Motorcycle and Boat
 - Rechargeable and Button Cells
- Pool Chemicals
- Darkroom Chemicals
- Aerosol Cans (not empty)
- Propane and Hellum Cylinders (BBQ-sized or smaller)
 \$5.00/20 lb, cylinder; no charge for small cylinders
- Small Quantities of Asbestos (up to 100 lbs., wetted, double bagged and sealed with duct tape; no siding)
- Driveway Sealant and Roofing Tar
- Fluorescent, HID Lamps and PCB-Ballasts
- Mercury-containing Devices (e.g., thermometers, thermostats, mercury switches, manometers)

UNACCEPTABLE MATERIALS

- <u>Drums of Any Material</u>: Large quantities of waste should be transferred to 5-gallon pails prior to delivery.
- Latex Products: These are non-hazardous, water-based paints that should be dried out and disposed of in the garbage. To dry out, remove lid and add an absorbent material, such as cat litter or clay speedy dry, to speed the drying process. Once the material is hard and not in liquid form, throw the can into the garbage with the lid off.
- Grout, Spackle, and Joint Compound: Dispose in garbage.
- * Empty Containers: Once a material has been used up, put the empty container into the garbage.
- Highly Reactive or Unstable Materials: Items such as benzoyl peroxide, gunpowder, chlorine (wet or gaseous), dioxane, any of the "ethers," ethyl nitrate, any of the "nitro" compounds, phosphorous, picric acid, potassium perchlorate, pyridine, potassium and/or sodium metals, uranium/uranyl compounds, old chemistry sets, etc., call (973) 631-5109 for approval prior to transporting any of these materials.
- Unknown Materials: If unlabeled or unidentifiable, please call (973) 631-5109 for authorization to bring the material to the MCMUA HHW Disposal Program.
- Business Waste: HHW Cleanup Days are specifically for Morris County residential HHW. Business waste is accepted only at the MCMUA Permanent HHW Facility located in western Morris County. In addition, business waste is limited to a maximum monthly accumulation of 220 lbs., and there is a handling fee for it. For more information about business generated-waste, please call (973) 631-5109.
- Smoke Detectors: Return to manufacturer listed on back.
- Medical Waste: Call the MCMUA at (973) 631-5109 for more information.
- Tires: Check with your town or call the MCMUA at (973) 829-8585.

DIRECTIONS:

Chatham High School

From the West: Take Route 124 east into Chatham Borough. Make a right onto Lafayette Avenue. Go approximately two (2) miles. Chatham High School will be on the left.

The Morris County Public Safety Training Academy

From the North: Take Interstate Route 287 southbound to Exit 36 (Lafayette Avenue/Ridgedale Avenue). Follow signs to Ridgedale Avenue, and at the traffic light at the bottom of the ramp, make a right onto Ridgedale Avenue. Take Ridgedale Avenue north for ¾ of a mile to East Hanover Avenue (there is a Sunoco station at the intersection). Make a left onto East Hanover Avenue and take it four (4) miles (it turns into West Hanover Avenue) to the Morris County Public Safety Training Academy, which is on your right-hand side as you go up a steep hill. Make a right-hand turn into the parking lot.

From the South: Take Interstate Route 287 northbound to Exit 36B (Lafayette Avenue). Move into the right-hand lane of the exit ramp and bear right onto Ridgedale Avenue. Take Ridgedale Avenue north for just under one (1) mile to East Hanover Avenue (there is a Sunoco station at the intersection). Make a left onto East Hanover Avenue and take it four (4) miles (it turns into West Hanover Avenue) to the Morris County Public Safety Training Academy, which is on your right-hand side as you go up a steep hill. Make a right-hand turn into the parking lot.

Jefferson Township DPW Complex/Recycling Center

From the Pequannock, Butler, Kinnelon, Lincoln Park Areas: Take Route 23 North to Oak Ridge Road. Follow to the first traffic light and turn right. Go to the blinking light and turn left onto Schoolhouse Road. Take Schoolhouse Road to the end and turn right. Follow to Weldon Road and turn left. The municipal building is approximately ½ mile on the right. Go past the entrance and make the next right onto Sparta Mountain Road. The DPW Complex/Recycling Center is on the right.

From the East: Take Route 80 West to Route 15 North to Weldon Road. Stay on Weldon Road approximately six (6) miles. Make the first left past Jefferson High School (Sparta Mountain Road). The DPW Complex/Recycling Center is on the right.

From the West: Take Route 80 East to the Wharton exit. Go through the first traffic light and bear right onto Route 15 North. Follow to Weldon Road. Stay on Weldon Road approximately six (6) miles. Make the first left past Jefferson High School (Sparta Mountain Road). The DPW Complex/Recycling Center is on right.
