MEETING OF PUBLIC AND INVITATION FOR DISCUSSION

Mayor Alviene opened this portion of the meeting to the public for discussion.

Barbara Victor, 21 Myrtle Avenue is present this evening concerning the intersection of Myrtle Avenue and Belleview Avenue, earlier in the week a high school teenager was involved in a serious car accident at the intersection. Ms. Victor's husband has previously spoke on this at Council meetings. She submitted some ideas to the Mayor and Council (Attachment A). Chief Chimento is present this evening he provided statistical information noting that over a three year period there have been 660 accidents investigated throughout the Borough. Of the 660 accidents 5 occurred at Myrtle Avenue and Belleview Avenue, which equates to approximately 1.6 accidents a year at that intersection. He is not discounting what Ms. Victor is saying, however the statistics show that there are minimal events that occur at that location. Of the five accidents that have occurred at that location one was weather related, one involved two senior citizens that may have played a role in the accident. The three remaining accidents were all exclusively caused by driver inattention, someone running the stop sign. He rarely opposes increased traffic safety; however, in this particular instance, three traffic studies were conducted and the conclusion reached in all of the studies that making it a four way stop sign it would be nearly

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impossible for vehicles traveling down Belleview Avenue to come to a complete stop. This would be the case especially in poor weather conditions, as was evidenced by the traffic report for one of the accidents. Regarding the other suggestions he is not opposed to maybe some grooves or additional lighting around the stop sign. Ms. Victor suggested zebra stripes in the cross walk would provide increased notification.

<u>June Moffa, 76 High Street</u> noted that she travels through that intersection regularly and she feels that it is hazardous and the mirror does not help with safety. She feels that the area is just a bad accident waiting to happen.

Mayor Alviene thanked everyone for their comments; he feels that something should be done in the area that may alleviate some of the issues. Perhaps painting something in the intersection may solve some of the problem. Chief Chimento wanted to thank the Department of Public Works for their help in keeping the foliage in the area trimmed so there is better visibility.

<u>Kami Ramautar, 75 Belleview Avenue</u> she thinks the intersection is terrible, she also feels that speeding occurs on a regular basis. She would like something done about the speeding.

Angie Moses, 17 Cleary Avenue is the mother of one of the individuals involved in the car accident from last week. She wanted to know if any studies have been done regarding the volume of the traffic at this location. Can the signs be removed noting that this is the route for the business district as she feels that this has increased traffic in the area. Chief Chimento explained that when the road was being constructed the Borough tried to fight this but to no avail. She asked approximately how long it would take for the signs and additional safety precautions to be implemented. Mr. Lampmann asked for direction on what exactly would be done; once that is determined, he will then have a better idea of the time it will take.

<u>Danielle Aranguren, 71 Belleview Avenue</u> she noted that she is directly in the middle of the block between Pearl and Myrtle, she stated that she is home during the day and she hears people speeding all day long, and they are drivers of all ages. She is happy that the Mayor and Council will be addressing this issue.

<u>Kellie Davidson, 16 Sanders Place</u> is present this evening to ask the Mayor and Council if they would adopt a proclamation and raise the Pride flag for the month of June, as she is a strong supporter of the LGBTQ++community. She feels that flying this flag will signal Butler as an all-inclusive and accepting community. Ms. Davidson brought up the Mayor and Borough Council voicing support in 2018 for a member of the State Legislation, Mayor Alviene stopped Ms. Davidson from commenting about this individual, as they were not present to defend themselves.

<u>Michael Moffa, 76 High Street</u> is present this evening in support of Butler adopting the proclamation and flying the Pride Flag, he thinks that it would be sending such a positive message for human rights and civil liberties. He feels those are the two key points that the movement is about and he feels this will go a long way.

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<u>Katie O'Neill, 72 Bartholdi Avenue</u> her daughter would have attended but she is currently employed out of state for the summer. She has witnessed change at Butler High School, when her daughter attended the school derogatory terms were common, it no longer occurs. She feels that by flying the Pride flag and adopting the proclamation will show that Butler is accepting of all people.

Zoey Heath, 3 Village Way, Vernon is present this evening in support of any proclamation or flying the Pride Flag, while she was in Vernon High School she started the first Gay-Straight Alliance, these are safe spaces for individuals who may be curious or who have not revealed themselves. She has heard some terrible stories from individuals and would like all communities to be accepting of all people regardless of their sexual orientation.

<u>June Moffa, 76 High Street</u> wanted to share something that occurred at Ridgewood High School, she feels that it is a great example a superstar on the Ridgewood High School track team came out to his teammates they embraced his decision and he was accepted by his teammates, coaches and friends. She feels that flying the flag would be a gift to the community.

Mayor Alviene polled the Borough Council about adopting the proclamation naming June as Pride month in the Borough of Butler. The Borough Council unanimously agreed to adopt the proclamation.

Mayor Alviene read the following proclamation into the record.

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BOROUGH OF BUTLER PRIDE MONTH PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Butler recognizes and proclaims the month of June 2019 as Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender and Queer (LGBTQ) "Pride Month" throughout the Borough of Butler; and

WHEREAS, Butler Borough joins the other Morris County Municipalities in observing Pride Month honoring the history of the LGBTQ liberation movement and to support the rights of all citizens to experience equality and freedom from discrimination; and

WHEREAS, all human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights. LGBTQ individuals have had immeasurable impact to the cultural, civic and economic successes of our country; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Butler is committed to supporting visibility, dignity and equality for LGBTQ people in our diverse community; and

WHEREAS, while society at large increasingly supports LGBTQ equality, it is essential to acknowledge that the need for education and awareness remains vital to end discrimination and prejudice; and

WHEREAS, this nation was founded on the principle that every individual has infinite dignity and worth, and the Borough Council of the Borough of Butler calls upon the people of this municipality to embrace this principle and work to eliminate prejudice everywhere it exists; and

WHEREAS, celebrating Pride Month influences awareness and provides support and advocacy for the Borough of Butler's LGBTQ community, and is an opportunity to take action and engage in dialogue to strengthen alliances, build acceptance and advance equal rights.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Butler Borough Council hereby proclaim the month of June 2019 as Pride Month in support of the LGBTQ community.

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Mayor Alviene noted that perhaps a pole could be erected and should it happen it must be available for other months for other organizations so that all organizations would have the same rights. He does not believe there should be any problems with that he does not believe that they will be able to do it for this month, perhaps it can done for future years. He reiterated that the pole must be made available to other organizations so that the pole will be used all year round. Ms. Davidson presented the Pride flag to the Mayor and Council for future use.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES AND DEPARTMENT HEADS:

<u>Councilman Fox</u> regarding streets and roads a walking tour of Hamburg Turnpike took place and it was marked out with Tilcon in preparation for paving, which is still 4 to 6 weeks out before it will be done. In addition, two sections of Maple Lake Road were marked out for repaving as the road is in poor shape. Storm water catch basin repairs are ongoing, approximately 20 tons of asphalt has been used for various potholes, berms and utility patches and Hamburg Turnpike and Belleview Avenue.

<u>Councilman Travers</u> will provide an update at the next meeting on infectious diseases. Three area restaurants are in pre-occupancy inspection status, according to the health inspector it is going well. Thursday, June 20 between 5:00 and 7:00 p.m. the Borough of Butler will be having the free skin cancer screening, it is a great program.

Councilman Meier reporting on the Electric utility they are prepared as summer is approaching with adequate stock to deal with any heat related issues. A request was received from Richard Butler School to speak about electricity and electrical safety, Jeff Ricker Electric Superintendent was able to order coloring books and sticker sheets, along with "Butler Power" erasers. Mr. Ricker spoke on Electric safety and demonstrated the equipment that is used. A considerable amount of time was spent in Kinnelon on a primary pole line in the Long Meadow swamp. In Butler, crews provided power for the Butler Day celebration, removed materials and transformers from Butler Plaza prior to demolition of the buildings. Repairs, replacements and new service hookups were completed where necessary. West Milford and Riverdale were quiet for the month. All meters were read and recorded, delinquent electric accounts, both residential and commercial were handled, outage calls and customer complaints were handled in a timely fashion. The Butler Museum is putting on Space Day on Saturday, July 20, 2019 the Museum will be open from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

<u>Councilman Calvi</u> reporting on the Water Department a water main break occurred during the early morning hours of June 11, at the intersection of Carey Avenue and Robert Street, repairs took approximately 12 hours. A second water main break occurred on South Gifford Street in the afternoon of June 13, 2019; approximately 21 customers were without water while repairs were completed over the course of 12 hours. Northwestern Avenue water main replacement phase 1

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project has begun as of June 17, 2019, the project should take several weeks to complete and routing customer service and mark outs were completed in a timely manner. Reporting on the Sewer Department the new inspection camera has arrived and will be used as part of the new preventative maintenance program. The Sewer department experienced no emergencies since last report.

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BOROUGH OF BUTLER

ORDINANCE NO. 2019 - 12

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT CHAPTER 143 ("LAND USE") OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF BUTLER

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Butler, in the County of Morris and State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 143, "Land Use," Section 143-119, "Purposes," of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Butler shall be amended by the inclusion of new and revised Subsections G, H, M and N which shall read, in their entirety, as follows:

- G. R-7 Residence District. To provide an area for high-density multiple-family units. This is located adjacent to the highway commercial district, thereby providing appropriate ready access to shopping facilities and certain employment opportunities.
- H. R-8 Townhouse/Apartment Residential District. To provide for townhouse and apartment development.
- M. LI/CBD Light Industrial/Central Business District. The purpose of the LI/CBD Light Industrial/Central Business District is to encourage a full mix of commercial/light industrial land uses to enable the area so designated to redevelop in flexible but controlled fashion.
- N. RD Redevelopment. The purpose is to provide for a mixed-use commercial, retail and residential development in an area of downtown Butler Borough which has been determined to be in need of redevelopment.

Section 2. Chapter 143, "Land Use," Section 143-121 shall be retitled "Apartment regulations in the R-6
Residence District and townhouse regulation in the R-7 Residence District,"
of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Butler, and shall be amended by following amendment to
Subsection B(4) which shall read, in its entirety, as follows:

- B. Area and bulk regulations.
 - (4) Maximum density: R-6: 12 dwelling units per acre. R-7: six dwelling units per acre.
- Section 3. Chapter 143, "Land Use," of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Butler, shall be amended by repeal of Section 143-122, 143-123.1, and 143-123.2.
- Section 4. Chapter 143, "Land Use," Section 143-5, "Definitions," of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Butler, shall be amended by the following revision to the definition of "Vehicle, Recreational," which shall read, in its entirety, as follows:

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VEHICLE, RECREATIONAL - A vehicular type of portable structure which may be towed, hauled or driven and which is primarily designed as a temporary living accommodation for recreational camping and travel, including, but not limited to travel trailers, truck campers, camping trailers and self-propelled motor homes. For purposes of regulating boats, motorcycles, ATV'S, snow mobiles, and similar equipment, including the trailers used to transport the same shall also be included. Recreational vehicles shall not exceed a bumper-to-bumper length of 36 feet (including trailer) or a height (including trailer) of 10 feet measured to the top of the roof.

Section 5. Chapter 143, "Land Use," Section 143-143, "Parking and storage of vehicles on residential lots," of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Butler, shall be amended by the following inclusion of new subparagraph (5) to Subsection H. which shall read, in its entirety, as follows:

(5) Only one self-propelled motor home is allowed which shall not exceed a bumper-to-bumper length of 36 feet (including trailer) or a height of 10 feet measured to the top of the roof.

Section 6. Chapter 143, "Land Use," Section 143-131, "Front yard setback adjustment," of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Butler, shall be amended to read, in its entirety, as follows:

§ 143-131. Front yard setback adjustment.

- A. Minimum front yard setbacks, as regulated and provided in Schedule "D", may be modified so that the minimum setback shall be established by utilizing one (1) existing principal structure on either side of the subject site, on the same side of the street. The front yard setback adjustment for corner lots shall be that setback associated with the main front entrance to that structure.
- B. Existing conforming one and two-family uses may extend to the 35' height limitation, the front yard setback notwithstanding. The new structure must conform to the minimum side and rear setbacks, and may not exceed the existing front yard setback of the dwelling. Section 143-135B, "Extensions into yards," shall not be applicable to this provision.

Section 7. Chapter 143, "Land Use," Section 143-22, "Expiration of variances," of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Butler, shall be amended to read, in its entirety, as follows:

§ 143-22. Expiration of variances.

Any variance from the terms of the Zoning Regulations hereafter granted by the Planning Board permitting the erection or alteration of any structure or structures, or permitting a specified use of any premises shall expire by limitation unless such construction or alteration shall have been actually commenced on each and every structure permitted by said variance, unless such permitted use has actually been commenced, or unless an extension of time is granted by the Board, within 36 months from the date of entry of the judgment or determination of the Planning Board except as otherwise provided by law; except however, that the running of the period of limitation herein provided shall be extended from the date of filing an appeal from the decision of the Planning Board to a court of competent jurisdiction, until the termination of any manner of such appeal or proceeding, and provided further, that in the event another agency approval is required and the application is pending before the other agency at the time of approval, then the thirty-six-month period shall commence after receipt of that other approval.

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Section 8. Chapter 143, "Land Use," Schedule B, "Off-Street Parking Requirements," of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Butler, shall be amended by the following additional requirement:

Section 10. Chapter 143, "Land Use," Schedule D, "Area and Bulk Regulations," of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Butler, shall be amended to delete light industrial use in the R-7 zone, delete the residential use in the LI/CBD zone, and provide the additional footnote (13) which shall read in its entirety as follows: (13) Minimum 1,200 square feet for each store/office/unit; and to amend the bulk requirements for the R-1 Zone to read as follows:

If any section or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid in any Court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect the other sections or provisions of this Ordinance, except so far as the section or provision so declared invalid shall be inseparable from the remainder or any portion thereof.

Section 12. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances which are inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 13. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after final passage and publication in the manner provided by law.

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BOROUGH OF BUTLER ORDINANCE NO. 2019-13

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF DEED OF EASEMENT AND RIGHT OF WAY IN BUTLER BOROUGH PARK FOR THE PEQUANNOCK RIVER BASIN REGIONAL SEWERAGE AUTHORITY PERMANENT SEWER EASEMENT

WHEREAS, the Pequannock River Basin Regional Sewerage Authority (the "Authority") proposes to construct an 18" diameter sanitary sewer line underneath the Butler Borough Park and therefore it was necessary to remove the Green Acres restrictions for its construction, maintenance and use (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, in conjunction with the Project, it was necessary to remove the Green Acres restrictions for a permanent sewer easement consisting of 1,655.96 square feet (0.038 acres) in Block 14, Lot 30 situated in Borough Butler Park and set forth in a metes and bounds description prepared by DMC Associates, Inc. Professional Land Surveyors, dated August 13, 2018 (the "PRBRSA Permanent Sewer Easement") included in the "Green Acres Application, Pre-Application and Final Application for Minor Disposal or Diversion of Parkland, Proposed Sanitary Sewer Installation, Borough of Butler Parkland Lot 30, Block 14," (the "Green Acres Diversion Parcel"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority has previously adopted a Resolution authorizing payment in the not-to-exceed sum of \$2,781.45 to the Borough of Butler, subject to approval by the State House Commission of the minor diversion or disposal necessary for PRBRSA'S Permanent Sewer Easement that was the subject of the Green Acres Application, as full Green Acres compensation for said diversion or disposal to be utilized towards installation of two new park benches and concrete base pads on Lots 1 and 30 in Block 14, to be completed by the Borough of Butler within six months of State House Commission approval; and

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WHEREAS, the NJDEP Commissioner and the State House Commission agreed to release the Green Acres Diversion Parcel from Green Acres restrictions under the terms and conditions approved by the NJDEP Commissioner on February 4, 2019 and by the State House Commission on May 9, 2019 (DEP SHC File #1403001) as described in Schedule C to the Green Acres Release and Compensation Agreement that is to be executed by the Borough of Butler; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution adopted on June 18, 2019, the Borough of Butler adopted a Resolution authorizing execution of the Green Acres Release and Compensation Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Butler desires to convey to the Pequannock River Basin Regional Sewerage Authority the 0.038 Green Acres Diversion Parcel upon full execution of the Green Acres Release and Compensation Agreement, and in accordance with the Local Lands and Buildings Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:12-13(b)(1); and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Butler desires to authorize the execution of the Deed of Easement and Right of Way for the Green Acres Diversion Parcel in substantially the form on file at the offices of the Borough Clerk, subject to NJDEP's execution of the Green Acres Release and Compensation Agreement for the Green Acres Diversion Parcel.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough of Butler, in the County of Morris, State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1. The Mayor is authorized to execute the Deed of Easement and Right of Way, in substantially the form on file at the offices of the Borough Clerk, which shall not become effective until the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection executes the Green Acres Release and Compensation Agreement for the Green Acres Diversion Parcel.

Section 2. If any section or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid in any Court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect the other sections or provisions of this

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Ordinance, except so far as the section or provision so declared invalid shall be inseparable from the remainder of any portion thereof.

Section 3. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances which are inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after final passage and publication in the manner provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 2019 - 14

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND REVISING CHAPTER 33, "BUTLER MUSEUM AND HISTORICAL COMMITTEE," OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF BUTLER AND TO AMEND MEMBERSHIP PROVISIONS

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Butler, in the County of Morris, and State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 33 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Butler, "Museum and Historical Committee", shall be amended by the following amendment to Subsection A of Section 33-3 which shall read, in its entirety, as follows:

§ 33-3. Membership; terms; compensation.

A. The Butler Museum and Historical Committee shall be comprised of up to eleven (11) members to be appointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of the Council. The Committee may provide for mandatory membership obligations and may allow up to four of its members to serve in a reserve or temporarily inactive capacity under appropriate circumstances to be established by Committee rules. A quorum for conducting Committee business shall consist of one-half of the current active membership.

Section 2. This Ordinance may be renumbered for codification purposes.

Section 3. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances which are inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after final passage and publication in the manner provided by law.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Butler previously adopted a Resolution endorsing the filing of its combined Pre-Application and Final Application (the "Green Acres application") for the disposal of Green Acre restrictions within a portion of the Borough of Butler Park situated in Block 14, Lot 30 and necessary for a permanent sewer easement, consisting of 1,655.96 square feet (0.038 acres) (the "Green Acres Diversion Parcel"); and

WHEREAS, the compensation to be provided for the removal of Green Acres restrictions from the Green Acres Diversion Parcel, as contained in the Green Acres application, is a payment from the Authority in the not-to-exceed sum of \$2,781.45 to the Borough of Butler as full Green Acres compensation to be utilized towards installation of park improvements on Lots 1 and 30 in Block 14, to be completed by the Borough of Butler within six months of State House Commission approval; and

WHEREAS, the NJDEP Commissioner and the State House Commission agreed to release the Green Acres Diversion Parcel from Green Acres restrictions under the terms and conditions approved by the NJDEP Commissioner on February 4, 2019 and by the State House Commission on May 9, 2019 (DEP SHC File #1403001) as described in Schedule C to the Green Acres Release and Compensation Agreement, a copy of which is attached this Resolution; and
