## **CORRESPONDENCE**

A letter from Cherie Pettenger Hiller re: 53 Carey Avenue

Ms. Pettenger read a letter (copy attached) regarding her property located at 53 Carey Avenue, the Planning Board recently heard a variance application from the prospective buyer, and the board noted there was not enough parking for the proposed use, the board did not render a decision as the applicant withdrew the application. Ms. Pettenger informed the Mayor and Council that she had a conversation with a member of the Recreation Commission, who stated they might be interested in purchasing this property for use by the Recreation Commission. Ms. Pettenger noted that it is becoming increasingly difficult to pay the real estate taxes for this property while living on a fixed income. Mayor Alviene explained that should the Borough procure this property, renovations would be required to bring the building up to code and add another property for the Borough to maintain. Councilman Fox noted that he sits on the Planning Board, but does not sit on use variance applications, stated you cannot "spot zone" or do an overlay. Furthermore, when you apply to the Land Use Board for a variance you put forth your request, present evidence and let the Board decide. The consensus was that when Ms. Pettenger finds another buyer a new application would be required. Mr. Oostdyk stated the options available, which are continuing current usage, which is as an educational use; apply to the Planning Board for a variance to change the current usage designation, parking would be one of the areas reviewed. reiterated that the Board has an open mind regarding applications. Mr. Oostdyk explained that the Board would work with applicants to rehabilitate the property; however, any changes in usage would require application to the Board. Mr. Pettenger noted that the owner of 45 Carey Avenue expressed interest in annexing the property. Additionally, Mr. Pettenger explained that he has been financially helping his parents, but with his own family and home, he is sure that if the property is not sold, it will probably end up in tax sale. The Mayor and Council instructed Ms. Pettenger to contact Karen Becker for her insight on this issue.
