The Workshop Meeting of the Borough of Butler Mayor and Council was opened by Mayor Alviene who indicated that the meeting was being held in compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act having been duly advertised and posted in Borough Hall.

Discussion

Discussion – Kinnelon Water/Sewer Extension – Walnut Lane Mr. Lampmann explained that this is part of Kinnelon's plan to build an emergency/recreation center. The most cost effective way for Kinnelon to do this would be to extend the water/sewer lines going through Walnut Lane into Kinnelon. The Borough of Butler would only be responsible for the section that is in Butler. The Department of Environmental Protection and Pequannock River Basin Regional Sewerage Authority must approve the Treatment Works Application prior to any work commencing. The original water/sewer agreement with Kinnelon would require amending should the DEP approve this application, additionally, if septic systems in this area in Kinnelon fail, they would be required to hook into the system. Mr. Lampmann will request that laterals be installed to the curb for Butler residents as part of this project; therefore, the road will not need to be dug up should Butler residents wish to utilize those utilities.

Discussion – 2019 Capital Improvements – Mr. Lampmann explained that the general improvements could be covered without borrowing any money. Regarding electric capital requests, monies need to be borrowed to cover those requests. Water Utility requests are higher this year with the largest expenditure being the AMI system; however, this may be spread out over several years.

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Mr. Kozimor provided a brief synopsis of the 2019 Budget noting that the municipal tax increase will be \$25.90 for the average assessed home (\$253,000). Any questions please contact either Mr. Lampmann or Mr. Kozimor, as the budget is on schedule to be introduced at the March 19, 2019 meeting.

Discussion – Limitation on the Hours of Collection for Waste – Mr. Oostdyk provided the Mayor and Council with a sample ordinance regarding limitation on the pickup hours. Mr. Lampmann explained that we have had a number of complaints from residents regarding waste being picked up at various overnight hours. The purpose of this ordinance is to limit those hours, however, Mr. Oostdyk cautioned that this may create other problems, however this ordinance would make trash pickup hours uniform with the Borough hauler. Notification will be made to all the commercial businesses regarding the limitation on hours of pick up.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING APPROVAL OF AND CONSENT TO THE FILING OF THE TREATMENT WORKS APPLICATION FOR THE WALNUT LANE SANITARY SEWER EXTENSION

ORDINANCE NO. 2019 - 02

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT CHAPTER 129 ("GARBAGE, REFUSE, AND RECYCLABLES") OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF BUTLER AND REGULATING THE HOURS FOR COLLECTION OF WASTE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Butler, in the County of Morris and State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 129 (Garbage, Refuse, and Recyclables) of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Butler, Section 129-1 ("Limits on Collection") shall be amended by the inclusion of new Subsection E which shall be entitled "Regulations Concerning Hours for Collection of Waste" which shall read, in its entirety, as follows:

- E. Regulations Concerning Hours for Collection of Waste.
- (1) Collection services provided by a hauler contracted by the Borough to provide service shall be conducted only within the hours provided for in the bid specifications for solid waste and recyclable material collection services promulgated by the Borough. It shall be a violation of this Chapter for any hauler to engage in collection activities outside of the hours permitted in the specifications.
- (2) Privately contracted waste collection services within the Borough shall be conducted only between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and sunset, Monday through Friday. It shall be a violation of this Article for any property owner, owner/operator or lessee to allow collection and/or any hauler to engage in any collection outside of these hours.

Section 2. If any section or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid in any Court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect the other sections or provisions of this Ordinance, except so far as the section or provision so declared invalid shall be inseparable from the remainder or any portion thereof.

Section 3. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances which are inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

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Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after final passage and publication in the manner provided by law.
