WHEREAS, after careful consideration the following individual Michael J. Buonforte is hereby appointed to the position of Police Officer for the Borough of Butler; and

WHEREAS, the County of Morris Public Safety Training Academy starts in January 2020, and it is the intention of the Borough that the appointee Michael J. Buonforte shall be enrolled in said Academy to commence with courses of instruction immediately; and

WHEREAS, the employment of appointee Michael J. Buonforte shall be conditioned upon his passing all applicable Borough requirements and be effective January 2, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Butler Borough Council believes that the hiring of the new police officer as referenced above is in the best interests of the health, safety and welfare of the Borough's residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Butler, in the County of Morris and State of New Jersey, as follows:
