

NOTICE TO BUTLER ELECTRIC UTILITY CUSTOMERS

In the Matter of the Petition of Butler Electric for Approval of a Zero Emission Certificate Recovery Charge

Notice of a Filing and Notice of Public Hearings BPU Docket No. EO22100629

TAKE NOTICE that Butler Electric Utility (“Butler” or “Company”) filed a Petition with the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities (the “Board”) seeking the Board’s approval of a Zero Emission Certificate Recovery Charge (“ZECRC”)

The legislation establishing the ZECRC directs the New Jersey Electric Distribution Companies (“EDCs”) to return excess monies in each EDC’s separate, interest-bearing account to its retail distribution customers at the end of each energy year. Butler proposes to set its Refund of Excess Collections Credit Rate (“RECCR”) to \$0.000073 (a charge above the established \$0.00400 regular rate) as of January 1, 2023 to prevent further under-collection.

In October 2021, the Company filed to increase the RECCR (that is, to reduce the customer credit rate) from (\$0.000149) per kilowatt-hour without Sales and Use Tax (“SUT) to (\$0.000083) per kilowatt-hour, without SUT. The Company designed the proposed rate to return Energy Year 2021 over-collections totaling \$8,730.86 over a 12-month period commencing January 1, 2022. However, the proposed rate did not become effective until May 1, 2022, resulting in an excess return of over-collection to customers. As a result, the Company estimates an under-collected balance, including interest, of \$11,139.54 as of January 2023. Additionally, during Energy Year 2022, the Company’s ZECRC over-collections totaled \$3,379.70. As a result, the estimated net balance for Energy years 2021 and 2022 would be an under-collected balance of \$7,754.89. Given this under-recovery, the Company is proposing to set the RECCR to \$0.000073 beginning January 1, 2023. Any remaining balance due to customers, including interest, will be carried over to the next year’s RECCR filing.

The below chart shows the estimated bill impact of the proposed increases in charges based on the revised RECCR for each rate class, although the actual effect on specific customers will vary according to the applicable rate schedule and level of the individual customer’s usage. The impact for a Butler Electric residential customer, living outside of the Borough of Butler, using 6.920kWh annually would be \$1.44 per year or 0.14%.
