The Council Meeting of the Butler Mayor and Council was opened by Mayor Martinez who indicated that the meeting was being held in compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act having been duly advertised and posted in Borough Hall and on the Borough website. This was followed by The Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence for all that have passed.

MEETING OF PUBLIC AND INVITATION FOR DISCUSSION

Mayor Martinez introduced BP&L Superintendent Jeff Ricker. Jeff took the floor to thank and honor Tim Siek as he retires from BP&L after 25 years of dedicated service.

Mayor Martinez opened the meeting to the public.

Cathy Teeling – 12 Western Avenue - came forward and asked what the Mayor and Council plan to do with downtown Main Street because it is "atrocious". Mayor Martinez explained what has been done in the past (signage, clean-up days, additional cans, adding a 3rd pick-up day) as well as what is currently happening including an agenda item later in the meeting to discuss obtaining cameras.

Denis Goerner – 40 Manning Ave resident & 170 Main St. business owner – says it's a mess (Main St), wants ordinances enforced or just take it off the books. Says he has video evidence of rats going back and forth to the garbage and his building. Says he called the health dept. and gets fed a bunch of "bologna". Said he also has evidence of who puts trash out but won't provide it to the town because it will just cause more problems or broken windows like the place next to him. The Mayor and Councilman Calvi explained that our challenge is the enforcement of it. Mr. Goerner got hostile and began cursing – wants the landlord to be held responsible but Mayor doesn't think its fair to punish a landlord when someone drives up and dumps bags or comes from down the street and places it elsewhere to avoid punishment. Today's laws do not hold people accountable. He then talked about our "stupid" parking ordinances and said they get a ticket for that so we need to do the same. Mayor and Councilwoman Orcutt said garbage bags don't have a license plate on it to see whose trash it is. Mayor said crimes aren't enforced half the time under our judicial system never mind someone who puts trash out too early.

Dan Masin – 81 Bartholdi and Borough employee stated the town is nice enough to put garbage cans out when in reality it's not their responsibility. The sidewalks and trash cans are the landlords responsibility. No one is cleaning his sidewalks, providing cans or cleaning overflown trash on Bartholdi. There is NO Pride in storefronts. He said tax payers' dollars are being wasted having DPW come in to clean and empty trash cans when it should be the landlords responsibility. He has personally seen people empty trash from their cars on to the sidewalk, so it's not just the tenants. He also stated has rats coming from an unkept property behind him on Boonton Ave. Mr. Woods explained the dumping of trash from vehicles can be enforced much easier than issues with enforcement of overflowing. He also said commercial law requires snow, trash, etc. cleanups are the landlords responsibility! They are all responsible for getting their own private haulers. Mr. Masin said no other businesses in town get 3 x's weekly pickup. Mr. Woods asked how people would feel if we gave a summons because it was in front of your store and you knew it wasn't yours or your tenants. Mr. Masin asked about a dumpster being placed on Main Street by museum but realistically no one is going to walk over there with trash. It will also potentially add to a mess/overflowing and rats there as well. Mr. Masin wants to know who enforced his rat complaint at his property. Lengthy conversation took place among all members. Clerk Greco explained she sees a

copy of all summonses and knows they all end up in Riverdale Court but until we write to our legislators and bring back bench warrants or accountability everything is a slap on the wrist and nothing is enforceable.

Julie Ruighaver – 6 Stonybrook Ct. – stated she has had conversations with the Mayor and is also concerned about Main Street. She inquired about dumpsters between or behind buildings. Council President Verdonik said not only would it take away from already little parking, people come and overflow our dumpsters right up at Borough Hall so what's to stop them from doing it on Main Street? Councilman Calvi asked if it's the volume of bags or is it loose trash from overflows. Mayor said cameras will be a good start seeing who is doing it. Her husband then followed up saying dumpsters are not an option because he sees it all the time by his work. Anyone will just drive up and dump in the dumpster. He said cops are not the answer either because we will be back here regarding raising taxes again if we have to pay all that overtime.

Cathy Teeling again- said police should be used but only for a short time. Once people see we are serious, the behavior will stop. Mayor Martinez said it would have to be 24/7 and it is not feasible! He thinks cameras will be more effective to deter people. She wants to know who is going to monitor these cameras. She said she's lived here for 57 years and its not the town she grew up in and wants to know what will be done. Council President Verdonik said we are starting with signs and letters to the landlords and we will proceed from there. He also explained he's lived here his whole life as well and how its unfortunately a very different feel in town – neighbors don't even know each other any more when they used to bbq and hang out all the time together. It's just a very different society. She then complained how single family homes have 7 cars in the driveway and wants to know why someone isn't driving around and doing something about that. The Borough attorney said the constitutional issues that would arise from that would be unbelievable.

Mr. Goerner again stepped forward and said a bag was already outside even though today was garbage day. BA Matthew Guilder said if he is not made aware there is nothing he can do. If the footage is brought to him, he can handle it. Mayor said if we have public cameras they wont have to worry about using his.

Seeing no one else come forward, a motion was made to close this public portion of the meeting.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES AND DEPARTMENT HEADS

Council President Verdonik stated we are doing okay financially and he did not attend the Recreation meeting.

<u>Councilwoman Orcutt</u> stated in the Water Dept., routine maintenance and customer service continues as needed. Meter replacement and upgrades continue with approximately 80% completed. Hydrant repairs will be done this summer. In Sewer, routine maintenance and inspections were performed as necessary. No back-ups or pump station issues since last report. DPW personnel provided assistance to PRBRSA engineers for survey and inspection work.

<u>Councilman Calvi</u> stated in the Road Dept., street sweeping and pothole repairs continue as needed. DPW crews are performing storm drain repairs throughout the Borough. Bid specs have been repaired for the replacement of the street sweeper. Road resurfacing will begin in August. An ordinance will be voted on for the funding later this evening.

<u>Councilman Piccirillo</u> stated we had 26 MV accidents, 16 considered reportable with 12 injuries. No DUI arrest. 73 summonses were issued from 157 stops and 5 arrests for a variety of offenses. 1749 total service calls for the month. 12 firearm applications processed.

Councilman Guzman reported on the recent Health Dept. inspections that took place as well as new licenses issued.

UNFINISHED/NEW BUSINESS

Clerk Greco announced an application was received from Mathnasium for use of Butler Park on August 16th. All approved.

Mayor Martinez introduced Drew from Verkada to take the floor for his Main St camera presentation. Afterwards, Drew answered questions regarding retention period, quantity, size, installation, warranty, troubleshooting, facial recognition, increase in OPRA demands, liability, redaction, retention periods, archiving, who sets the view/zone, site distance, invasion of privacy, price, software updates, how powered, who does initial installation. BA Matthew Guilder said capital funds will be available for a portion of the initial purchase. After the initial 30k (plus 6k if installation required) for a 5-year term, an annual licensing fee will apply and will need to be considered in the budget. Mr. Woods said he will concur with other attorneys to make sure there are no legal issues with privacy. Clerk Greco questioned how OPRA litigation holds and redactions would be handled.

Health Insurance - BA Matthew Guilder said he continues to explore other options due to the pending astronomical increase by NJSHBP. Our claims are through the roof so we are in a bad place. With such high claim levels, no one else wants us. 13 employees have claims over 50K annually and claims are double what our payments are.

Water Treatment Superintendent - Mr. Guilder said the vacancy caused by Keith Smith's departure is a difficult spot to fill. They do have one candidate, and would like to make him an offer. We can do a conditional resolution at the end of the meeting to temporarily appoint.

Newark Water Interconnect – Mr. Guilder said they had a field visit with Montana to set up the pump house and we must prioritize this to get done. We need to negotiate contract standards with Newark for the interconnect (aka back-up system) as of right now we are being quoted \$4,500/month.

Mayor Martinez opened the meeting to the public.

Anton -6 Stonybrook – he inquired whether Verkada would provide training on the cameras for key people in town, He also inquired about the retention period.

Dan Masin – 81 Bartholdi questioned whether we are invading privacy because these are private sidewalks!! He feels it is a gray area. Council President said there is a Right of Way there.

Denis Goerner – questioned if the resolution of the camera is affected by light (day/night) and weather conditions. Drew from Verkada said they are 5 mega pixels.

ORDINANCE # 2025-04

ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS OR PURPOSES TO BE UNDERTAKEN BY THE BOROUGH OF BUTLER, IN THE COUNTY OF MORRIS, NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING \$141,005 THEREFOR FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND OF THE BOROUGH.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF BUTLER, IN THE COUNTY OF MORRIS, NEW JERSEY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvements described in Section 2 of this ordinance are hereby authorized as general improvements to be made or acquired by the Borough of Butler, New Jersey, and there is hereby appropriated therefor the sum of \$141,005 from moneys available in the Capital Improvement Fund of the Borough.

Section 2. The improvements hereby authorized and the several purposes for the financing of which the appropriation is made as provided in Section 1 of this ordinance are as follows: (i) the acquisition by purchase and installation, as necessary, of new and additional equipment including computer equipment for use by the Administrative Department of the Borough, a live scan fingerprint system, an up fitting Ford interceptor, radar equipment, one (1) armor system plate carrier, one (1) tactical helmet and 911 dispatch technology equipment for use by the Police Department of the Borough, and SCBA bottles, turnout gear, pagers and radios for use by the Fire Department of the Borough; and (ii) the improvement of various recreational facilities in and by the Borough, together with for all the aforesaid all equipment, attachments, accessories, site work, structures, work, materials, costs and expenses necessary therefor or

incidental thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor on file or to be filed in the office of the Borough Clerk and hereby approved.

Section 3. The capital budget or temporary capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing all detail of the amended capital budget or temporary capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, are on file with the Borough Clerk and are available for public inspection.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect after publication after final passage as provided by law.

BOND ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$1,058,530, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$741,250 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH, FOR VARIOUS IMPROVEMENTS OR PURPOSES AUTHORIZED TO BE UNDERTAKEN BY THE BOROUGH OF BUTLER, IN THE COUNTY OF MORRIS, NEW JERSEY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH
OF BUTLER, IN THE COUNTY OF MORRIS, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of
all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The several improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby respectively authorized as general improvements to be made or acquired by The Borough of Butler, New Jersey. For the said several improvements or purposes stated in said Section 3, there are hereby appropriated the respective sums of money therein stated as the appropriations made for said improvements or purposes, said sums being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor and amounting in the aggregate to \$1,058,530 including the aggregate sum of \$33,750 as the several down payments for said improvements or purposes required by law and more particularly described in said Section 3 and now available therefor by virtue of provision in a previously adopted budget or budgets of the Borough for down payment or for capital improvement purposes and including also, in the case of the improvement or purpose described in Section 3(a) hereof, the sum of \$283,530 received or expected to be received by the Borough from the New Jersey Department of Transportation as a grant-in-aid of financing said improvement or purpose.

Section 2. For the financing of said improvements or purposes, including for the purpose of applicable United States Treasury regulations the reimbursement of expenditures heretofore or hereafter made therefor, and to meet the part of said \$1,058,530 appropriations not

provided for by application hereunder of said down payments and grant, negotiable bonds of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$741,250 pursuant to the Local Bond Law of New Jersey. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable notes of the Borough in a principal amount not exceeding \$741,250 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 3. The improvements hereby authorized and the several purposes for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued, the appropriation made for and estimated cost of each such purpose, and the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for each such purpose, are respectively as follows:

(a) Improvement of Hillcrest Avenue in and by the Borough by the construction or reconstruction therein so as to provide a roadway pavement at least equal in useful life or durability to a roadway pavement of Class B construction (as such term is used or referred to in Section 40A:2-22 of said Local Bond Law), together with all milling, road reconstruction, drainage improvements, curbing, equipment, work and materials necessary therefor or incidental thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor on file or to be filed in the office of the Borough Clerk and hereby approved, the \$383,530 appropriation hereby made therefor being inclusive of the sum of \$283,530 received or expected to be received by the Borough from the New Jersey Department of Transportation as a grant-in-aid of financing said improvement

(b) Improvement of various roads in and by the Borough by the construction or reconstruction therein of roadway pavements at least equal in useful life or durability to a roadway pavement of Class B construction (as such term is used or referred to in Section 40A:2-22 of said Local Bond Law), together with for all the aforesaid all planning, design, engineering, paving, structures, appurtenances, equipment, work and materials necessary therefor or incidental thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor on file or to be filed in the office of the Borough Clerk and hereby approved

(c) Acquisition by purchase of new and additional vehicular equipment including one (1) street sweeper for use by the Department of Public Works of the Borough (said vehicle having a gross vehicle weight in excess of 15,000 pounds), together with all attachments, appurtenances, accessories and equipment necessary therefor or incidental thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with the specifications therefor on file or to be filed in the office of the Borough Clerk and hereby approved

Except as otherwise stated in paragraph (a) above with respect to the said \$283,530 grant-in-aid of financing said improvement, the excess of the appropriation made for each of the improvements or purposes aforesaid over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor, as above stated, is the amount of the said down payment for said purpose.

Section 4. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

- (a) The said purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses and each is a property or improvement which the Borough may lawfully acquire or make as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
- (b) The average period of usefulness of said purposes within the limitations of said Local Bond Law and taking into consideration the respective amounts of the said obligations authorized for the several purposes, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is ten (10) years.
- (c) The supplemental debt statement required by said Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in said Local Bond Law is increased by the

authorization of the bonds and notes provided for in this bond ordinance by \$741,250, and the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

- (d) Amounts not exceeding \$100,000 in the aggregate for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering costs and other items of expense listed in and permitted under Section 40A:2-20 of said Local Bond Law may be included as part of the costs of said improvements and are included in the foregoing estimate thereof.
- (e) Paragraph (a) of Section 3 of this bond ordinance authorizes obligations of the Borough to be issued for a project funded by a grant from New Jersey Department of Transportation and pursuant to section 40A:2-11(c) of said Local Bond Law no down payment is required for such obligations.

Section 5. The funds from time to time received by the Borough on account of the grant referred to in Section 1 of this bond ordinance shall be used for financing the improvement or purpose described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance by application thereof either to direct payment of the cost of said improvement or purpose, or to payment or reduction of the authorization of the obligations of the Borough authorized by this bond ordinance. Any such funds so received may, and all such funds so received which are not required for direct payment of such costs shall, be held and applied by the Borough as funds applicable only to the payment of obligations of the Borough authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 6. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer, the acting chief financial officer or the treasurer of the Borough (the "Chief Financial Officer"), provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall

determine all matters in connection with the notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. §40A:2-8. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale at not less than par and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the dates of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body of the Borough at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the principal amount, interest rate and maturities of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 7. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of said obligations and interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 8. The capital budget or temporary capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing all detail of the amended capital budget or temporary capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, are on file with the Borough Clerk and are available for public inspection.

BUTLER BOROUGH RESOLUTION 2025-89

RESOLUTION OPPOSING NEW JERSEY PROTECTING AGAINST CLIMATE THREATS/RESILIENT ENVIRONMENTS AND LANDSCAPE RULES (NJPACT)

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Butler opposes the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection's (NJDEP) 1,057-page NJPACT rules due to their significant adverse impacts, and sets forth the following objections:

A. NJPACT'S CREATION, IMPACT, AND CONSEQUENCES

- NJPACT, stemming from Governor Murphy's Executive Order 100, imposes excessive building regulations, including raising homes and roads 5 feet above base flood elevation, far exceeding federal and local standards, effective around August 2026.
- NJPACT rules will devastate coastal economies, reducing property values, tourism, and housing affordability, impacting the entire state's economic vitality and exacerbating housing shortages.
- 3. NJPACT relies on a sea level rise study with only a 17% likelihood 75 years from now
- Homes along the Jersey Shore, typically replaced every 25-30 years, would be overbuilt under NJPACT, imposing unnecessary costs when risks could be reassessed in 2050 or 2075.
- NJPACT's costs make compliance unaffordable for current and future homeowners, forcing middle-class retreat and favoring the ultra-wealthy.
- NJPACT aligns with National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) minimum standards but offers no premium discounts for exceeding them, creating financial burdens without benefits.
- Without funding, NJPACT's enforcement strains municipalities, risking economic disaster for tourism-dependent seasonal economies.
- Unfunded mandates may lead to inconsistent regional protection, disproportionately harming smaller communities.

B. REALITIES AND PRUDENT COURSE

- With an 83% probability that NJPACT's mandates will be unnecessary in 76 years, a more gradual, legislatively supported approach is warranted.

- NJPACT's extreme approach, based on unlikely scenarios, defies science and burdens residents and municipalities unnecessarily.
- The Borough of Butler supports reasonable climate policies but requests NJPACT's withdrawal or amendment to a fact-based, gradual approach.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Butler vigorously opposes NJPACT due to its threat to public health, welfare, and economic stability.
